3 – Nebuchadnezzar's First Dream (Daniel 2:1-49)

I. The King's Nightmare (2:1-16)

A. The king dreams (2:1)

- 1. The timing of the dreams (2:1a)
 - The dreams occurred in the second year of Nebuchadnezzar's reign.
- 2. The nightmares (2:1b)
 - The king had a reoccurring dream that caused him not to sleep.

B. The dreams meaning sought (2:2-11)

- 1. The wise men are summoned (2:2)
 - The king summoned his wise men into his presence to interpret his dream.
- 2. The king's request (2:3)
 - The king stated that he was anxious to know the meaning of the dream.
- 3. The wise men's request (2:4)
 - The wise men requested that the king tell them what he had dreamed.
- 4. <u>The king's demand (2:5-6)</u>
 - The king demanded that they tell him what he dreamed and its interpretation.
 - The king stated that they would be executed if they could not.
 - The king stated that there was a great reward for the one who could tell him.
- 5. The wise men's second request (2:7)
 - The wise men requested again that the king tell them the dream.
- 6. The king's demand restated (2:8-9)
 - The king stated that they were stalling for time.
 - The king accused them of lying to him.
 - If they could tell him the dream, he will know that they have the interpretation.

Convictions In A Hostile World: The Book of Daniel

7. The wise men's response (2:10-11)

- The wise men stated that no man could do as the king requested.
- They stated that only the gods could fulfill the king's request.

C. The king's anger (2:12-16)

- 1. The order to destroy the wise men (2:12)
 - The king was filled with anger and ordered the wise men killed.
- 2. The executions (2:13a)
 - The king's decree went out and they started to kill the wise men.
- 3. <u>Daniel and his friends are sought (2:13b)</u>
 - Because of the decree, they sought to kill Daniel and his friends.
- 4. <u>Daniel's question (2:14-15)</u>
 - Daniel asked the captain of the guard why the decree went out.
- 5. Daniel's request for time (2:16)
 - Daniel asked the king for time so that he could tell the interpretation.

II. The Dream Revealed (2:17-23)

- A. Daniel reports to his friends (2:17-18)
 - Daniel called his friends to pray for God's mercy for them.
- B. The dream revealed (2:19a)
 - The secret of the dream was revealed to Daniel in a night vision.
- C. Daniel's praise (2:19b-23)
 - Daniel praised God for revealing the dream and its interpretation.

III. Daniel Appears Before the King (2:24-30)

- A. The request to see the king (2:24)
 - Daniel went to the captain of the guard and requested to see the king.

Convictions In A Hostile World: The Book of Daniel

B. The captain's report (2:25)

- The captain brought Daniel before the king.
- He announced Daniel's intention to reveal the dream.

C. The king's question (2:26)

- The king asked Daniel if he is able to reveal the dream and its interpretation.

D. Daniel's response (2:27-30)

- 1. The wise men's inability (2:27)
 - Daniel proclaims that the wise men could not reveal the secret of the dream.
- 2. God and his purpose (2:28-29)
 - Daniel proclaims that there is a God in heaven who reveals secrets.
 - This God has made known to the king what will take place in the future.
- 3. The purpose for the interpretation (2:30)
 - Daniel stated that the secret was not revealed to him because of his wisdom.
 - The secret was revealed for Daniel's sake and the king's understanding.

IV. The Dream (2:31-35)

A. The awesome image (2:31)

- Daniel tells the king that he saw a great image that was splendid and awesome.

B. The makeup of the image (2:32-33)

- The image had a head of gold, chest of silver and thighs of bronze.
- The image had legs of iron and feet made of an iron and clay mixture.

C. The destruction of the image (2:34-35)

- 1. The stone (2:34a)
 - There was a stone cut out without hands.
- 2. The image destroyed (2:34b-35a)

Convictions In A Hostile World: The Book of Daniel

- The stone struck the feet of the image and broke them into pieces.
- The image was crushed together and blown away as chaff.

3. The rock becomes a mountain (2:35b)

- The stone became a mountain that filled the whole earth.

V. The Interpretation (2:36-45)

A. The interpretation announced (2:36)

- Daniel proclaims that he will tell the interpretation before the king.

B. <u>The head of gold (2:37-38)</u>

- Daniel proclaims that Nebuchadnezzar and his kingdom are the head of gold.

C. The second and third kingdom (2:39)

- After this another inferior kingdom will arise and another after it to rule the world.

D. The fourth kingdom (2:40)

- A fourth kingdom will arise that is as strong as iron and crush all others.

E. The feet of clay and iron (2:41-43)

- The fourth kingdom will be divided.
- It will be both strong and fragile.
- Different peoples will mix together in this kingdom but they will not be united.

F. God's kingdom (2:44)

- During the time of the divided kingdom, God will set up a kingdom.
- This kingdom will never be destroyed and is not left to other people.
- It will destroy other kingdoms and stand forever.

G. The certainty of the dream (2:45)

- Daniel tells the king that God has made known to him what will happen in the future.
- Daniel states that the dream and its interpretation are a fact.

VI. Daniel Honored (2:46-49)

A. The king's response (2:46)

- The king responded by humbling himself and honoring Daniel.

B. The king's proclamation (2:47)

- The king proclaimed that God is the true God since he revealed this secret.

C. Daniel and his friends promoted (2:48-49)

- Daniel was promoted to ruler over the province of Babylon.
- Daniel's friends were set over the affairs of Babylon.
